- Each year in the U.S. lung cancer in nonsmokers kills more people than AIDS.
- Over 50% of new lung cancer cases are diagnosed in the very late stages.

Here are the warning signs of lung cancer. If you have any of these signs, contact your doctor.

- Coughing up blood
- Chest pain
- Persistent coughing, wheezing, or hoarseness.
- Shortness of breath
- Repeated bouts of pneumonia or bronchitis
- Swelling of the neck and face
- Loss of appetite
- Fatigue

Lung cancer is often nearly symptomless in the early stages. Paying attention to these signs may save your life.
