Parents & Guardians - take note

The Pfizer vaccine is recommended for kids as young as age 12. Please note that an adult must accompany

children ages 12-15 to the vaccine appointment. If the adult present is not the parent or guardian, consent must be submitted in advance. For anyone



age 16-17, it's preferred that a parent or guardian accompany the minor to the vaccination site. We understand this may not always be possible. In those cases, the parent or guardian can provide written or verbal authorization.

The COVID-19 vaccine can now be administered at the same time as routine vaccinations, so now is the time to get the COVID vaccine and catch up on any routine vaccinations you may have missed during the pandemic.

Remember, once you're vaccinated (two weeks after getting the second dose), you won't be sidelined by quarantine from your favorite activities, so long as you don't develop symptoms. Find a clinic near you at OurShot.IN.gov.

Vaccine dashboard: Kids 12 - 15 now in the mix!



We've started adding data for our youngest Hoosiers who are eligible for the Pfizer vaccine. Check out Indiana's vaccine dashboard and click on "population" in the upper right corner. Over 10% of kids age 12 – 15 have already received their first doses.

Pfizer vaccine is suitable for ALL Hoosiers 12 and older. For your convenience, walk-up appointments are offered at most vaccination sites, but you can save some time by making an appointment and registering in advance. Visit QurShot.IN.gov and search by clinic's name or city.
